Student Expectations

Students are expected to come to school ready to give their personal best to both their classroom work and their behavior.

A good night's rest and a healthy breakfast are essential for them to meet these expectations.

Camp Tecumseh

Fourth graders travel to Camp Tecumseh for an overnight stay as part of their Indiana History curriculum. A parent meeting will be held in mid September to discuss and plan for this trip.

Curriculum

Curriculum for Religion is based on Archdiocesan guidelines while other subject areas follow the standards for the state of Indiana.

Graded Work

Work that has been graded is returned to student mailboxes and should then be taken home for parent review. Please ask your student regularly to see any work they have brought home. Working with them to correct any mistakes is a valuable learning experience.

Homework

Students should write assigned homework in their student planner each day. All homework should be completed by the due date. In case of an emergency, a parent note of explanation will allow the student an extra day to complete the assignment(s).

As a rule, students should be able to complete most homework in one hour or less, except for special assignments such as projects, reports etc.

Generally, homework is not assigned over weekends or vacations.

Homework Watcher

Assigned homework and other information/reminders are posted daily on Homework Watcher. Please remember to check this site regularly.

Mass Attendance

Students should come to school on days they attend Mass in Mass uniform unless otherwise specified (out of uniform days etc.). Students are expected to be attentive at Mass and to actively participate by singing, responding at appropriate times, etc. Participation during Mass will count as part of the Religion grade.

Rewards/Consequences

Students begin each day with three "French fries" with the goal of ending their "golden day" by keeping all three "French fries"(due to their good behavior), which in turn earns them a golden ticket.

Golden tickets are used at the end of each quarter to shop in Ms. Coleman's store for a variety of items.

Consequences for pulling a "French fry" are posted in the classroom and result in forfeiting their golden ticket for the day.

Consequences are: pull 1 "French fry" – walk ½ recess; pull 2 "French fries" – walk whole recess and write a note of explanation to parents to be signed and returned to school; pull 3 "French fries" – walk whole recess, write a note to parents, and meet with Mrs. England.

Continuation of misbehavior will result in a conference with student, parent(s), teacher and principal.

Snacks

Students are permitted to bring a healthy snack to eat at a specified time in the morning while working. Snacks are kept on hand for those who occasionally forget to bring one, but will not be provided on a regular basis. Please remind your student to pack a snack if he or she wishes to have one.
