

# Mural, sign, classroom dedication planned

Three new features at St. Rose of Lima Catholic School in Franklin will be dedicated Sunday.

The service, about noon, following the 11 a.m. church service, will dedicate a mural depicting the school's namesake, a modular classroom and a sign.

Two alumni are responsible for the mural and sign.

Feliz Morales, a freshman at Northland College in Ashland, Wis., painted the mural.

William Roush, a sophomore at Franklin Community High School, built the sign as part of an Eagle Scout project.

The modular classroom was purchased from Franklin schools for \$5,000.
